REACH + Aneurin Bevan Health Board working with families planning for next move from home supported living – Essential Lifestyle Planning (ELP) tool 18-19 years old – looking at how family supporting their children in future

– no support from outside.

Also working with a young person in transition and finding out what he wants to do; live residential home – no family input. Working on his future + where he wants to live.

REACH. Supported living predominantly Learning Disabilities some Physical Disabilities. 18+ 300 people being supported.

PCP – using variety of tools P.A.T.H., Essential Lifestyle Planning – using quite a bit to support people.

Consultancy PCP + ISD (Individual Service Design) in residential colleges or at home something happened and need support - labelled “challenging”.

Do a plan to support the person in a P.C. way. Recruiting staff. Need to change the way of thinking.

Intensive support team working with people in assessment unit. Influence health to think differently.

Bev Lane

0-5 service, Project Manager.

No “PCP” training to date.

Pilot started - 14 children and allocated professionals to work with them.

Extending the service was the aim; lead professional, training, initial assessment training all “in - house”.

Child with Disability Team, Care Co-ordinator (Monmouth) ICS (Integrated Children Services) info, working with respite service + setting up in South now running. To set up in North Monmouthshire too.

Helps with Early Support eg liaises with Julian Hallett, the Early Support Consultant. Working with a couple of families now which is nice. No PCP training yet.

Deputy Residential Home, Learning Disabilities + Physical Disabilities. 25-54 years age. Used to have PCP coordinator but not replaced yet. Looking if need to attach to a job or stand alone job.

Have 3 residential homes, no PCP training.

Torfaen TKW.

3 day HSA – 1 day Learning Disability Wales

Mike Logan

Transition Project Manager T.K.W. - Monmouth, Torfaen, Blaenau Gwent. continue funding in Caerphilly, Torfaen, Blaenau Gwent and hope be able continue work in Monmouth. Working with Learning Disability, Physical Disability, ASD, Mental Health + Aspergers 14-25 years of age. Focussing on transition tools + model handing over to others to use. Booklet available special needs with complex needs, mainstream schools + young person without statements.

Top 3 CCNUK Standards

As a way of getting to know the standards, and the role of person centred approaches in key working, three groups were asked to pick 3 standards out of 10 which they thought were the most important in terms of their own role.

Two groups chose:

2.5 – working across agencies – including agencies such as housing, leisure and benefits. Key workers need to know how to access, and what can be offered by, different agencies. It is important that managers see this as an integral part of the key worker's role.

2.11 – an information resource covering local services and their roles,

information about different conditions and impairments, and national organisations. Key workers or an information facilitator should guide families and ensure that they have information tailored for them that is accurate, accessible, timely and appropriate.

The following standards were only chosen by one group:

1.14 – monitoring, reviewing and evaluating the effectiveness of the service which must include the involvement of child/young person and family.

1.15 – all key workers to access training in person centred approaches

2.6 – working with families' strengths, acting as the child/young person's advocate or enabling parents, children/young people to access advocacy.

3.3 – supporting the child/young person's and family's preferences regarding assessment and review meetings.

3.4 – ensuring appropriate support for every child/young person to participate in their assessment and review using approaches such as person centred planning.

Conclusion – some standards are more relevant to young people, some to practitioners and others to parents
